7. Craft Ideas and Tutorials

Quick and Easy Ornaments

1. Salt Dough Ornaments

Ingredients: 1 cup salt, 2 cups all-purpose flour, 1 cup lukewarm water

- Mix ingredients to form a dough
- Roll out and cut shapes with cookie cutters
- Use a straw to poke a hole for hanging
- Bake at 250°F (120°C) for 2 hours
- Cool and paint as desired

2. Cinnamon Applesauce Ornaments

Ingredients: 1 cup ground cinnamon, 1 cup applesauce

- Mix ingredients to form a dough
- Roll out and cut shapes
- Use a straw to poke a hole for hanging
- Air dry for 24-48 hours, flipping occasionally

Festive Garlands

1. Paper Chain Garland

- Cut colorful paper into 1" x 6" strips
- Form the first strip into a loop and secure with glue or staples
- Thread the next strip through the first loop before securing its ends
- Continue until you reach desired length

2. Popcorn and Cranberry Garland

Thread a needle with strong thread or fishing line

- Alternate stringing popcorn and cranberries
- Tie off ends when you reach desired length

Wreaths

1. Ribbon Wreath

- Get a foam wreath form and various ribbons
- Cut ribbons into 6-inch lengths
- Tie ribbons around the foam form, pushing them close together
- Continue until the form is completely covered
- Add a bow or other embellishments as desired

2. Pinecone Wreath

- Collect and clean pinecones
- Attach pinecones to a wire wreath form using floral wire
- Fill in gaps with smaller pinecones or artificial berries
- Spray with artificial snow for a wintry look (optional)
